6. Planning sub-committee

(a) The meeting (with John Clayton) 30 June '93

(i) General

The purpose was a broad-ranging exchange of views. Successful.

(ii) Farthingloe reinstatement.

Agreed by a majority vote to write to DDC opposing the retention and proposed development of Farthingloe Village and suggesting more suitable sites.

(iii) Dover's town centres. John Clayton showed understanding of our views, while explaining economic and political limitations. There was some agreement about the siting of markets.

Agreed : to write again about the need for an overall, long-term plan for the whole area around the Russell Street car park.

It was also thought necessary to write to IMPACT about participation in their Forum .

(iv) On the W. Docks proposed development John Clayton was in general agreement with our views. He thought that the Marine Station should not be listed and, in consensus with JG, it seemed likely that realistically, only part ($\frac{1}{2} - \frac{1}{3}$) would be preserved and might serve as a cruise-liner terminal.

(b) Other planning matters.

To be watched : Kwik Snaks and Snargate Street. Cawsey's awning in Lorne Road refused. Whitfield by-pass : still possible to comment on landscaping. Most of our interventions have now been acknowledged. Some applications we objected to have been permitted.
