MINUTES of the 119th meeting of the Executive Committee held at 7.30 p.m.
on Thursday 14 Jan. 1999 at the Royal Cinque Ports Yacht Club.

APOLOGIES : JO MMcF

The MINUTES of the 118th meeting of 10 Dec. with two corrections were
passed and signed as correct.

1. MATTERS ARISING : ongoing :

* The historic plaques.

D.T.Council financial backing for the plaques will be considered at the next
meeting of the Finance Committee.

The Chairman was in communication with DDC who are also looking into possible
planning applications. They, with the Museum, suggest the inclusion of a plaque
in the underpass, marking the site of the discovery of the Bronze Age boat.

Discussion continues with the Banks about insurance. TS urged that the insurance
should be decided for all the plaques. The Treasurer urged that the Society
should avoid taking on the ongoing cost of insurance.

Agreed : To extend the planning to the first four plaques, Nos. 3 and 4
to be the Bronze Age boat and Zeebrugge on the Museum/Market Hall.
The wording on the last will be written by BA. BA

JW withdrew the suggestion of the P.G. Wodehouse plaque, because of its location.
