1. MATTERS ARISING :

Ongoing :

7. Dickens in Dover and 8. Maritime Hall : Phillip York Once the first plaque is in position then an approach will be made to the property owner.

9. William Burgess- Dover Town Council Offices Response awaited from Christine Waterman on information which might help.

10. Dover's place of execution - bottom of Tower Hamlets. The precise siting of this plaque is still to be decided.

The Copes were again thanked for all the considerable work involved.

2. CHAIRMAN

With the AGM approaching, the Chairman drew attention to the need to look ahead and keep the Committee up to strength. He and the Secretary will be retiring at the AGM of 2001.

JO and SS will be standing down at this year's AGM. (SS will continue the functions at the Planning sub-committee and DTC.) Both were thanked for their years of service.

BA may decide to stand down. He will consider and report within a week. BA

The Committee was asked for any suggestions for recruits. JC to be informed. First proposals were B.J. Late who might take on Projects when he retires from the DHB. Other suggestions were Dr. Hintonand Mr and Mrs Francis.

The Chairman had pursued the matter of replacing roadside trees with DDC and the three Dover County-councillors but without encouraging results. DL said that the River replanting showed that exceptions can be made.

The Underpass : The Chairman reported(i) that DDC had been advised against a temporary cover for the underpass and (ii) that there is provisional planning permission for re-building the demolished buildings as they were.
