Minutes of the Executive Committee, held on Thursday 8 March 2018
at St Mary's Parish Centre, Dover

1A. A presentation was given by William Parker-Gorman on building a bespoke website for The Dover Society. After a short discussion regarding costs etc. TS proposed we commission WPG to build website, it was agreed unanimously by the committee.

2. Minutes of the last meeting

The minutes of the meeting held on 8 February 2018 were accepted as correct.

3. Matters Arising

It was agreed at the last meeting the committee would look at the Civic Voice website and consider whether or not the Society should rejoin. A discussion followed and the majority agreed that no action be taken this time, but can be reviewed again at a later date.

4. Chairman's Report

Sustainability - DDC plan, agreed to leave alone until it can be understood.

Ward boundaries - proposed changes to the number of councillors from **56 to 32** to make the number of constituents each councillor represents to be approximately 2700 **was rejected by councillors. We await revised proposals before commenting.**

Heritage Open Days to be nationally publicised over two **weekends** in September. **Need to decide whether** we stay at one weekend in Dover or do we have two weekends? Diederick Smet would like us to make more of these days and link it with the Bluebird Trail as some of the buildings on the Trail will be open. **Diederik suggested** doubling the size of the Heritage Open Day leaflets to incorporate the Blue Bird Trail. There is a need to contact the owners of the buildings involved, the volunteers and obtain the extra cost of the leaflets. **Diederik also suggested activities at one or two locations but costs involved.** Action: DL to obtain information.

The 3 ladies who serve refreshments at our meetings are standing down. Agreed that 3 pot plants should be presented as a thankyou from Society funds.

The Wine and Wisdom event made a profit of £98.22. The custom, as in previous years, is to make a donation to Clive Taylor's preferred charity, The Crabble Corn Mill Trust. **Treasurer** proposing to make a donation of £70.00 and asking the committee to approve. The committee agreed to this.

No money was paid out from the River Dour Partnership Fund last month. The amount being held in their fund with us is £21,750.99.

The Bluebird Trail Fund remains the same at £777.44.
