

Budgerigar

The Budgerigar is a small Australian parrot. Very popular throughout the world as pets, along with the Bengalese finch and Java sparrow, the color and marking variations comprise more than 5,000 species. Wild varieties commonly have yellow heads with fine black horizontal bars from the crown to the back of the head. Adults grow to about 20 cm in length and they primarily eat plant seeds.

★ **Assembly Instructions**

- 1) Carefully cut out the parts.
- 2) Fold along the dotted lines, making mountain or valley folds as indicated.
- 3) Follow the order indicated in the instructional diagrams, and attach the parts to assemble.

- 4) Your paper craft model is finished!

★ **Tools**

Scissors, glue (We recommend craft glue.)

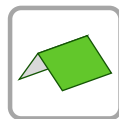
★ **Caution**

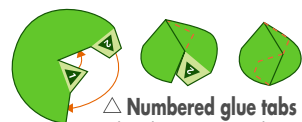
————— **Cut line**



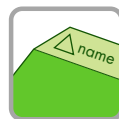
- - - - - **Mountain fold**



- - - - - **Valley fold**



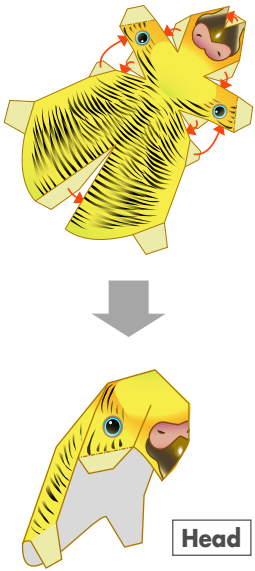
△ **Numbered glue tabs**
Glue the parts together in the order indicated by the numbers.



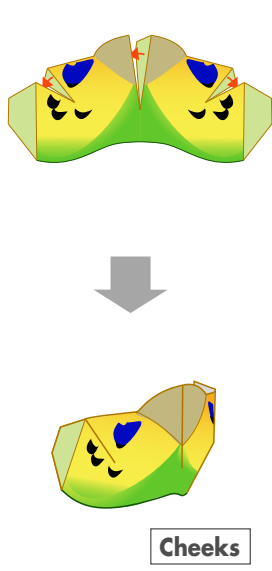
△ **Glue tabs with symbols and part names**
These tabs are to be glued onto the matching parts, which name is indicated on the tab.

★ **Assembling the Budgerigar**

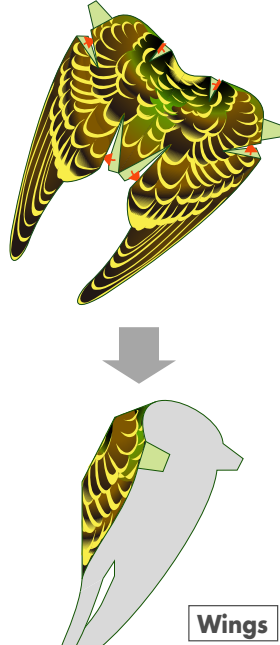
1 Assemble the head



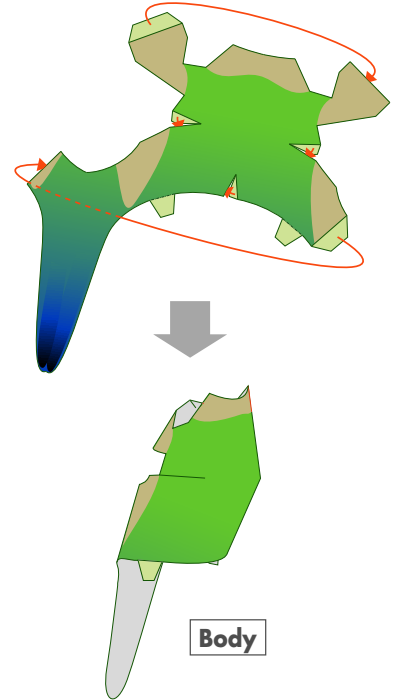
2 Assemble the cheeks



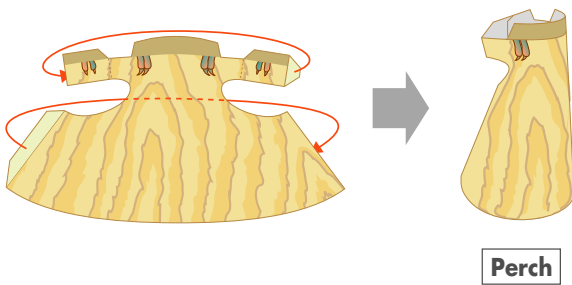
3 Assemble the wings



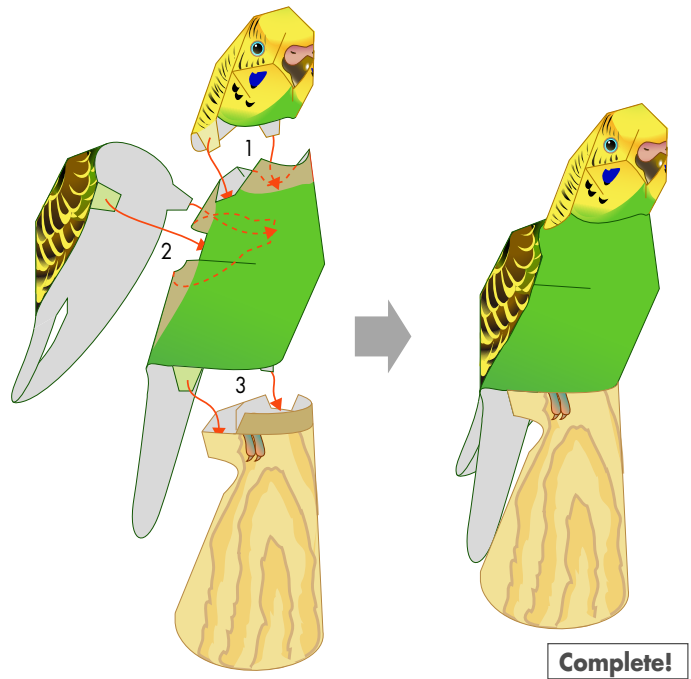
4 Assemble the body

To the body, attach in order first the head, second the wings and third the perch.
