

Four-toed hedgehog

The hedgehog is a mammal, and is closely related to the mole. There are 15 species of hedgehog which inhabit Europe, Asia and Africa. Hedgehogs have needle-like spines covering their bodies which are actually thick, stiffened hairs, and they use these to protect themselves from predators. Hedgehogs usually roll up into a ball and sleep during the day, then wake up after nightfall and begin hunting for insects and other things to eat. This paper craft model is based on the four-toed hedgehog (or African pygmy hedgehog), a hedgehog popularly kept as a pet.

★ Assembly Instructions

- 2) Fold along the dotted lines, making mountain or valley folds as indicated.
- 3) Follow the order indicated in the instructional diagrams, and attach the parts to assemble.

★ Tools

Scissors, glue (We recommend craft glue.)

★ Caution

Keep scissors and glue away from small children.
Be careful not to cut your fingers when using scissors.
Fold the folding lines before gluing.

- - - - - Valley fold



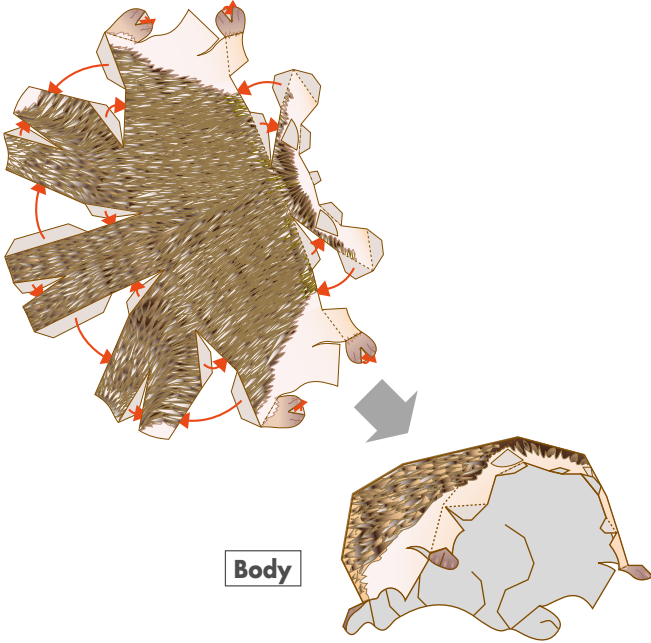
△ **Numbered glue tabs**
Glue the parts together in the order indicated by the numbers.



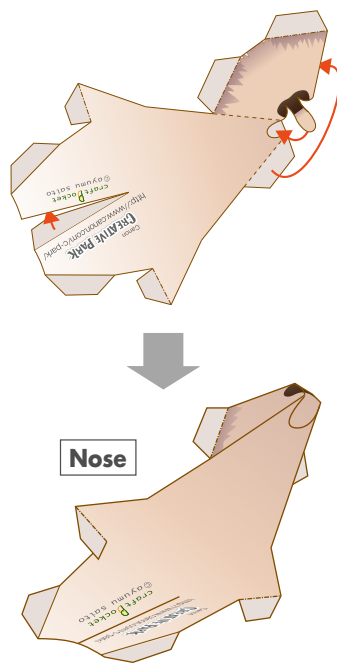
△ **Glue tabs with symbols and part names**
These tabs are to be glued onto the matching parts, which name is indicated on the tab.

★ **Assembling the Four-toed hedgehog**

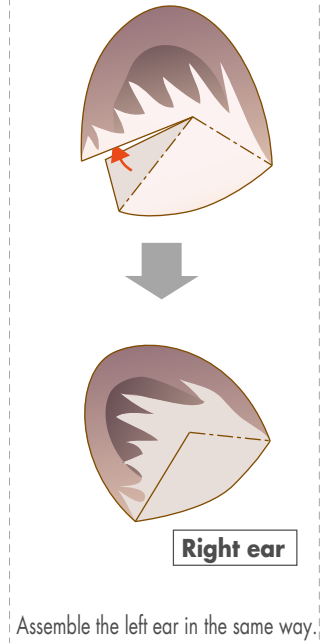
1 Assemble the body



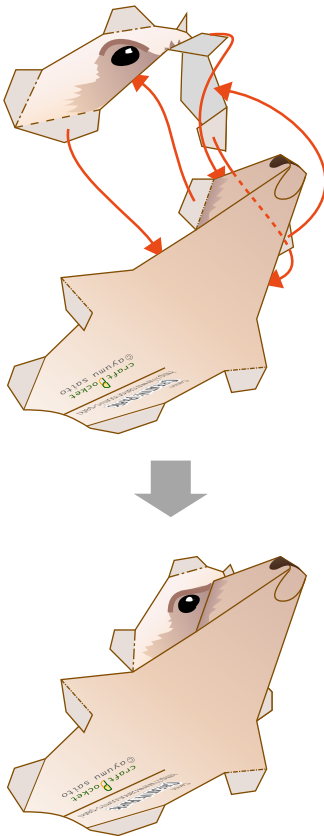
2 Assemble the nose



3 Assemble the ears

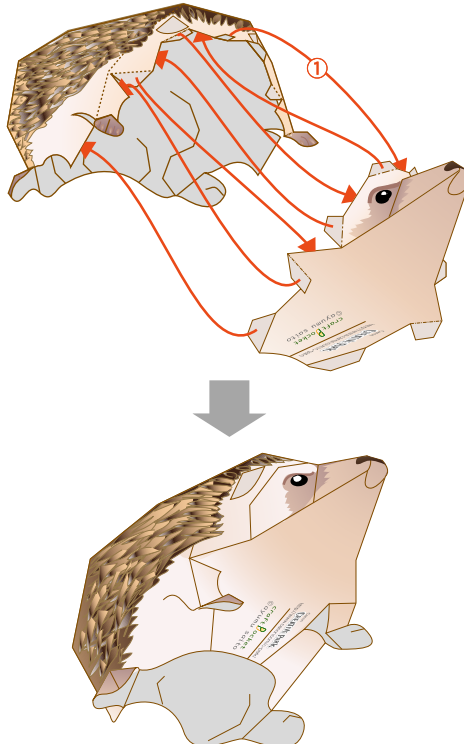


4 Attach the nose and eyes



5 Assemble the whole body

Begin with the part marked ① (the middle part) and attach each one in order, working towards the outside. Do the same for the other side.



6 Attach the ears
