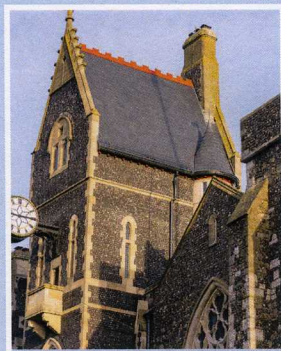

Built in 1665, Maison Dieu House began as the home and office of the Agent Victualler, who was in charge of the Dover Victualling Yard, which made ship's biscuit, salt meat and beer for the Royal Navy. It later became a private house, then Dover Library before being taken over by Dover Town Council. Discover fascinating stories linked to the building and Dover's civic history and take part in a fun, family-friendly activity.

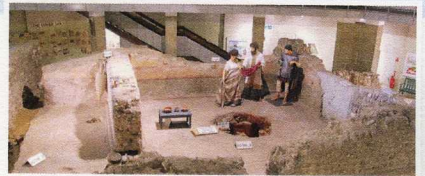
5 Roman Painted House

The Roman Painted House was discovered in 1970 and then excavated by local archaeologists during the following decade. Built in about AD200, it formed part of the Roman military site in Dubris – the Latin name for Dover. It has been described as the finest Roman house on show in Britain, with unique painted plaster walls (frescoes) and elaborate under floor heating (hypocaust). The site will be open for specially extended hours for Heritage Open Days.

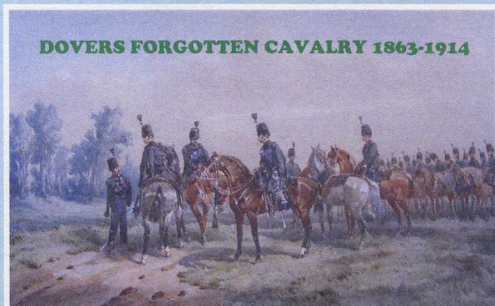

7 **Mon 14th September - Dover's Forgotten Cavalry 1863-1914 by Andy Rayner**

During the latter part of the Victorian era, and in the years leading up to the Great War, Dover was home to many thousands of Infantrymen, Royal Artillery Gunners, Royal Engineers, and men from other support services. What is often overlooked, however, is that during this time, Dover also had its own troop of cavalry.

These were the part-time, volunteer soldiers of the Royal East Kent Mounted Rifles, one of the regiments that formed the Yeomanry Cavalry.

Having recently discovered a source of original material, I am now able to tell the full story of Dover's cavalry troop, with a wide selection of period photographs, documents and notebooks. Come along and here the story of handsome, dashing and glamorous young cavalymen.....and their love of cricket!

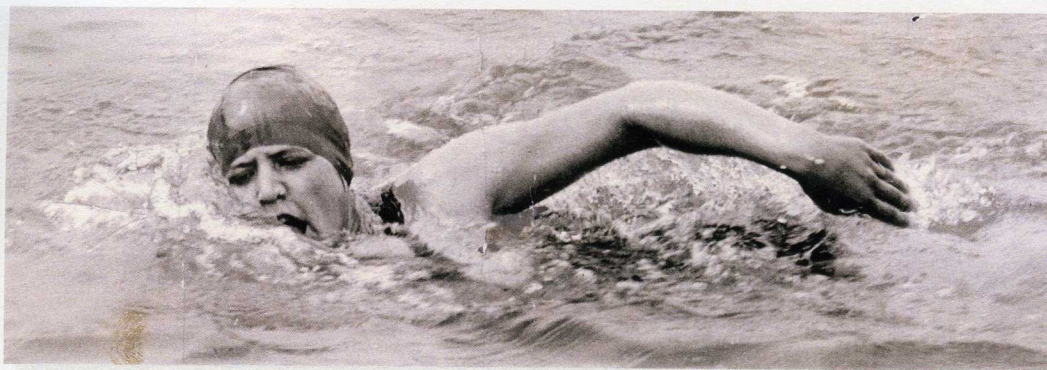


9 **Fri 18th September - Queen of the Waves: The story of Gertrude Ederle by Catherine Holt**

If weather is good wonder at the stunning sea views across to France!

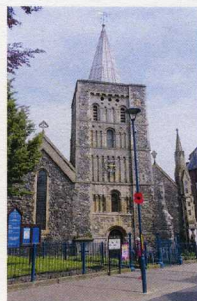
St Mary-The-Virgin Church

This prominent building in Biggin Street, dating from Saxon times, was built originally by the secular canons of St. Martin Le Grand, but was rebuilt by the Normans. At the Dissolution it was saved from demolition when Henry VIII granted it for use as a parish and civic church. Unfortunately, because of its weak foundations, it was rebuilt in 1843, although its original arches and columns were reinstated. The magnificent tower survived this restoration.

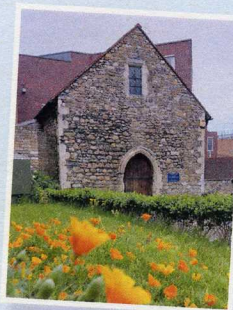
St Edmund's Chapel

This tiny medieval chapel was consecrated by St Richard of Chichester in 1253 in memory of his friend, St Edmund of Abingdon and was probably used as a cemetery chapel for the nearby Maison Dieu. Hidden from view for many years and used as a blacksmith's forge and workshop, it was revealed when buildings in front of it were destroyed in WW2 bombing. The chapel was restored and reconsecrated in 1968.

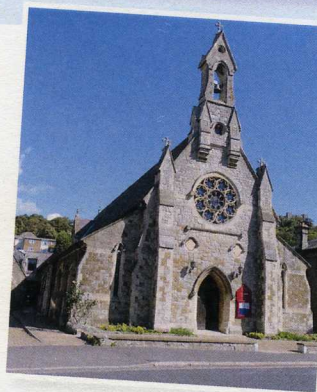
St Paul's Church

A beautiful church designed by Edward W. Pugin, son of the famous Augustus Welby Pugin. St Paul's was opened in 1868 after countess De Front left a legacy for it to be built. St Paul's has survived both WW1 & WW2, but succumbed to an arson attack in 1987. A massive restoration took place which resulted in the refurbished church of today.

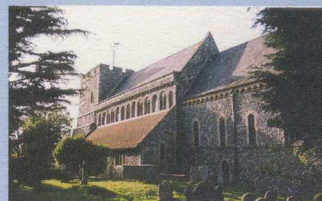
St Margaret of Antioch at St Margaret's-at-Cliffe

It's been the parish church for Elms Vale and Maxton for 125 years and many local people have been married there. It's in regular use on Sundays and hosts a vibrant toddler group, but is not otherwise usually open to the public. We have recently put an accessible toilet and coffee bar. Our garden has been converted into a community space for anyone to use for peace and quiet. Historically the building includes a communal air raid shelter and somewhere in the grounds is a barrage balloon mooring block.

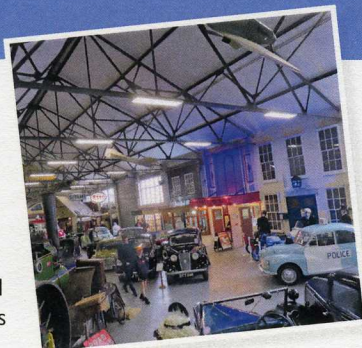

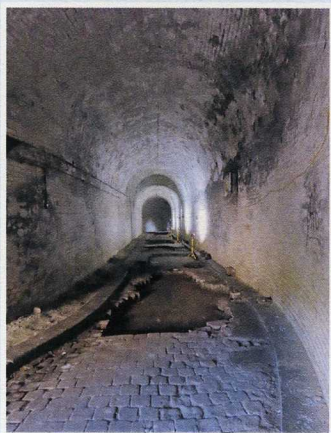

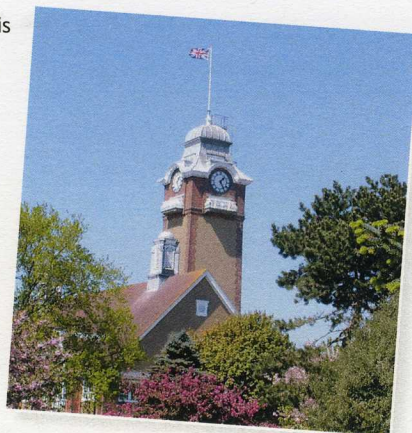
The Duke of York's Royal Military School has a rich history dating back to 1801. It was founded in Chelsea by the then Duke of York, known to all as the Grand Old Duke of York, to provide education for children of soldiers who had either been injured, killed or made destitute during the Napoleonic era. The school moved to its current purpose-built site in Dover in 1909. Our motto is 'Looking forward with confidence, looking back with pride' and it is with this in mind that we welcome visitors to the school today.

Guests will be met by the School Archivist and given a 90-minute tour which will include an introduction to the school's history, a tour of the Museum, and a visit to the School Chapel at the heart of the community. There will be an opportunity to see original documents and artefacts relating to the school's 225-year history. This will include items illustrating the personal stories of those who attended and worked at the school as well as its relationship with the town of Dover.

At the end of the tour senior students will be on hand to escort guests to their cars and tell them something of their experience of the school in the present day.

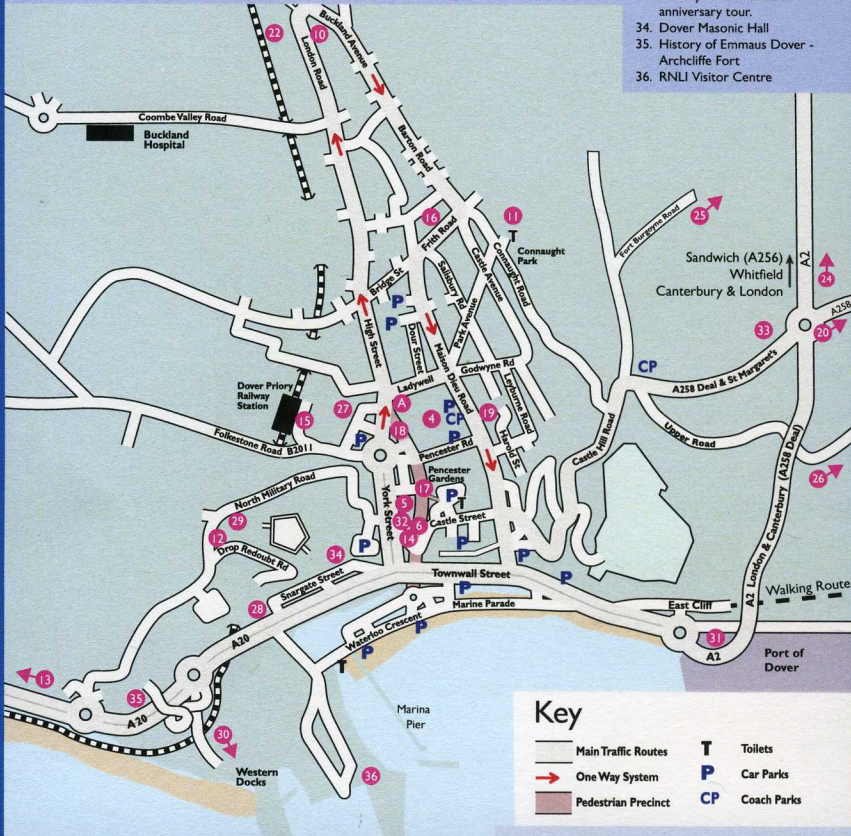
